• CAPD® Certification:

The education required for CEU completion will be available on-demand via a website portal. The cost of each CEU will be discounted for AZNHA certified members.

Licensing Terms:

- •Duration: Term of the license Two years, then renewable
- •Renewal Options: Before the end of the first term, set up new renewal.
- •Territory: Geographic scope of the license agreement applies to the State of Arizona.
